1 Introduction

A process management training for representatives of higher education institutions (HEIs) was held in Slovenia on 30 and 31 January 2025. The objectives of the training were threefold: (1) to equip HEI representatives with knowledge on managing projects as processes, (2) to guide HEI representatives in identifying and analysing their internal project management processes, and (3) to initiate the creation of an HEI community.

The two-day process management training was combined with the first consortium meeting on 29 January for organisational and cost efficiency reasons. The supporting documentation for the training event, including the invitation, agenda and signed attendance list, is provided in the following chapter.

With the process management event now successfully completed, the partners will proceed with activities to identify and analyse project management processes within their respective institutions. Guidebook on process management for HEI staff, prepared for this purpose, is referred to as D2.1. Feedback from the training participants will be included in the Phase 1 report (D2.3).
